Amor's phases will match Mexico's phases. All information is subject to change in line with Mexico's laws. All restrictions will be fully lifted once the color system is no longer in place.

Red/Maximum

Mexico

- Only essential activities will operate.
- Restrictions on high-risk individuals remain in place.
- No school activities or activities in public places.
- US/Mexico border restricted to essential work only.

Amor

- Update website with re-entry date.
- Complete re-entry plan.
- Mexican staff able to begin building, contingent on approval from Mexican government.
- Border crossing details confirmed for groups (declaration details).

Groups

- No groups accepted.

Orange/High

Mexico

- Essential and nonessential labor activities are permitted with certain limitations and always following safety protocols.
- Some restrictions apply to high-risk individuals.
- No school activities. Activities in public places are permitted but with certain limitations. Activities in closed spaces are not permitted.
- US/Mexico border restricted to essential work only.

Amor

- Update website with re-entry date.
- Mexican and US staff able to build, contingent on approval from Mexican government.
- Mexican volunteers to build, contingent on approval from Mexican government.
- Make groups aware of all protocols (through direct contact to Trip Coordinators).
- Border crossing details confirmed for groups (declaration details).

Groups

- No groups accepted.

Yellow & Green/Medium & Low

Mexico

- All economic and labor activities may be performed while following safety protocols.
- Restrictions on high-risk individuals continue.
- No school activities. Activities in public places are permitted with certain limitations. Activities in closed spaces may operate with restrictions.
- Mexican Customs permission for Amor to resume group trips.

Amor

- Continue to make groups aware of all protocols (through direct contact to Trip Coordinators).
- Mexican volunteers to build on worksites.
- Staff are following yellow & green restrictions (see Amor Safety Protocols).

Groups

- Groups can return.
- Restrictions on amount of people allowed per worksite (15).
- Groups can bring their own food (in compliance with SAGARPA regulations, no perishable foods). Groups will be encouraged to use La Cocina/Baja Cooks.
- Groups following yellow & green restrictions (see Group Safety Protocols).
- Individuals following yellow & green restrictions (see Individual Safety Protocols)

Personal Safety Protocols

Yellow & Green Phase

Prior to Trip (1-2 months out)

Amor team members have zoom meeting that is required for Trip Coordinators.

- All participants must sign DocuSign that states they agree to abide by all protocols.

Individuals are encouraged to bring their own personal supplies of:

- Hand soap/body soap
- Hand sanitizer with 60% alcohol
- Disinfectant wipes
- Face masks
- Gloves—latex or nitrile
- Disinfectant spray
- Thermometer

Prior to Trip (5-10 days out)

- Take steps to monitor your health; complete the 10-day COVID-19 log supplied by Amor.
- Participants must present a negative COVID-19 test within 5 days of their trip.

While Traveling

- Wash hands often with soap and water.
- Use hand sanitizer that contains 60% alcohol.
- Do your best to avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Wear a cloth face covering.

At Check-In/Traveling in Mexico

- Anyone exiting a vehicle must wear a face mask.
- Prior to arrival, coordinate with Amor if there is a need for grocery shopping in Mexico. Only two people from each group will be allowed to go grocery shopping.
- Visiting stores/shops, tourist locations (i.e. for tacos, drinks, beach etc.) will not be allowed throughout the trip.

At Camp

- The group will be given a map to show the layout of the camp and their designated camping area.
- While in group's designated camping area, face masks are optional.
- Outside of group's designated camping area (toilets, La Cocina, etc.), face masks will be required.

La Cocina

- Requirement to wash hands prior to meals.
- Each group will have their own designated eating area at their camping space.
- La Cocina will serve your group near your designated area.
- Face masks should be worn around La Cocina staff.
- Amor will provide igloo coolers for your camping area and worksite and will clean/disinfect at the end of each day.
- Each person should bring their own personal drinking container that they can fill up from the igloo coolers. Do not share with anyone.

Amor Store

- The Amor Store will be open for each group based on the colored flag assigned to your group.
- There will be one entrance and one exit to the store.
- Face masks and social distancing required inside and around the Amor Store.
- No one will be allowed to try on clothes.
- Tables/seats around the Amor Store are discouraged from being used. We ask that you hang out in your designated camping area.

Shower Enclosures

- Everyone is strongly encouraged to shower daily.
- Each group will be assigned a colored flag; this flag will be shown when it is your group's turn to use the shower enclosures.
- No solar showers will be kept by the shower enclosures; they must be kept in your individual camp area.
- Do not leave any personal items in the shower enclosures; items will be thrown away after each cleaning.

Toilets in Camp

- Your group will be assigned specific toilets that are for your group's use. They will be labeled with your group's colored flag and you are required to only use those toilets during your stay.
- Hand-washing stations will be provided by Amor near the toilets for your use.
- Toilets will be cleaned multiple times a day by Amor staff.

Worksite

- Masks must be worn at all times, except for eating and drinking.
- 15 people per worksite; this does not include an Amor team member.
- Group must stay within the marked work area.

- Groups are allowed on the worksite no earlier than 8am. Groups must be in camp no later than 5pm. Once in camp in the evening, no one is allowed to leave unless it is an emergency.
- Required attire: long pants, close-toed shoes, and masks.
- Encouraged attire: hat, glasses, long-sleeve shirts, and gloves.

Interacting with the Family/Community

- Social distancing will be required; the family will be given masks and asked to wear them.
- Non-monetary donations (i.e. Bible, blanket) to families are allowed but must be sanitized prior to delivery. The rule surrounding monetary donations to families will continue to be in place and is not allowed.
- No VBS or community outreach (interacting/playing with children) allowed.
- No physical contact (hugging, shaking hands) with the family and do not touch or pet any animals.
- Do not share or receive food/drink between your group and the family.

Tools

- If you bring your own tools, you will be responsible to clean/sanitize those tools.
- Amor will sanitize rented tools daily, as well as between each group. You will be encouraged to sanitize them at the end of each workday, too.

Toilet at Worksite

- Your group may; rent a toilet for their worksite, bring your own toilet seat covers or use the family's with the requirement to sanitize between each use.
- You must wash your hands after using the bathroom.

Cleanliness at the Worksite

- An area should be designated by your group to clean your hands. In this area should be things like a hand-washing station (i.e. igloo cooler with soap), sanitizers and substances to disinfect surfaces. Amor will not be providing these items to each group and we ask that each group brings their own supply.
- You are strongly encouraged to wash your hands throughout the day; especially after using the restroom and prior to eating.
- You should have your own personal drinking containers (i.e. water bottles) and not share. If a group is using La Cocina, Amor will provide igloo coolers for water/Gatorade. The group is responsible to sanitize the high-touch areas of the igloo coolers throughout the day.

Monitoring your own Health

- You will be required to take your temperature in the morning (prior to going to your worksite) and in the evening (around dinner time). All temperatures will need to be logged/written down within the

group. This should be monitored by the designated Safety Person in the group (see Group Safety Protocols).

- If you begin to feel ill or log a fever, you will be quarantined inside the Amor volunteer house. Amor and the group will collaborate on the plan of action (i.e. the need to send a participant home).

Group Safety Protocols

Yellow & Green Phase

Prior to Trip (1-2 months out)

- Amor team members have zoom meeting that is required for Trip Coordinators.
- All participants must sign DocuSign that states they agree to abide by all protocols.
- Group will be required to designate one person to be the Safety Person. This person will be responsible to help monitor and track the health of the group.
 - If your group has multiple worksites, each worksite will need one Safety Person.

Groups are encouraged to bring their own supplies of:

- Hand soap/body soap
- Hand sanitizer with 60% alcohol
- Disinfectant wipes
- Face masks
- Gloves—latex or nitrile
- Disinfectant spray
- Thermometer

Prior to Trip (5-10 days out)

- All participants are to take steps to monitor their health; complete the 10-day COVID-19 log supplied by Amor.
- Participants must present a negative COVID-19 test within 5 days of their trip (when the group leaves from their home).
- Both the COVID-19 log and the negative test should be verified by the group's Trip Coordinator.

While Traveling

- Wash hands often with soap and water.
- Use hand sanitizer that contains 60% alcohol.
- Do your best to avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Wear a cloth face covering.

At Check-In/Traveling in Mexico

- Anyone exiting a vehicle must wear a face mask.
- Prior to arrival, coordinate with Amor if there is a need for grocery shopping in Mexico. Only two people from each group will be allowed to go grocery shopping.
- Visiting stores/shops, tourist locations (i.e. for tacos, drinks, beach etc.) will not be allowed throughout the trip.

Cleanliness at the Worksite

- An area should be designated by your group to clean your hands. In this area should be things like a hand-washing station (i.e. igloo cooler with soap), sanitizers and substances to disinfect surfaces. Amor will not be providing these items to each group and we ask that each group brings their own supply.
- The group's Safety Person should monitor the group's designated cleaning area as well as help monitor the health of the group (staying hydrated, watching for signs of sickness, etc.).
- You are strongly encouraged to wash your hands throughout the day; especially after using the restroom and prior to eating.

- You should have your own personal drinking containers (I.e. water bottles) and not share. If a group is using La Cocina, Amor will provide igloo coolers for water/Gatorade. The group is responsible to sanitize the high-touch areas of the igloo coolers throughout the day.

Monitoring your own Health

- You will be required to take your temperature in the morning (prior to going to your worksite) and in the evening (around dinner time). All temperatures will need to be logged/written down within the group. This should be monitored by the designated Safety Person in the group. Amor will give the Safety Person a log for this purpose.
- If you begin to feel ill or log a fever, you will be quarantined inside the Amor volunteer house. Amor and the group will collaborate on the plan of action (i.e. the need to send a participant home).

Amor Safety Protocols

Yellow & Green Phase

Camp

Staff Housing

- Staff housing and La Cocina house will be cleaned and disinfected daily.

Rented Tents

- All tents will be sanitized inside and out before and after each group.
- Groups will be spaced out within at least one pad apart.

Hand-Washing Stations

- Stations will be set up near banos, La Cocina and the Amor Store.
- Staff will monitor stations to ensure they are stocked with water, soap, and hand sanitizer.
- Signage posted for hand-washing practices.

Banos

- Banos will be assigned to each group and marked with a colored flag for each group.
- Mark X's with paint outside banos for people to line up outside of to stay 6 ft apart.
- Banos will be cleaned 2-3 times/day by staff.
- Signage posted for social distancing practices.

Showers

- Shower times will be assigned to each group, made visible to them by the colored flag shown outside the showers.
- Showers will be cleaned in between each group's use.
- All items left in showers will be thrown away.
- CE Team needs to notify group when flag colors are changing to give groups notice to prepare.

Drink Stations

- Drink stations are for groups that use La Cocina only.
- They will be set up near each group's designated area.
- Amor's La Cocina team will be responsible to keep them stocked and cleaned each evening.

Meals

- La Cocina staff will always wear face masks and gloves.
- Servers will handle plates, utensils and food items.
- La Cocina will be serving meals to each group at their designated camping area.
- Participants should wear their masks around La Cocina staff.
- If a group is not using La Cocina, they are encouraged to follow the same protocols.

Meal Seating Area

- Groups are required to sit at the tables near their camping area.
- La Cocina staff will be required to clean and wipe down eating areas.
- Tables cleaned with soap, water, and bleach between uses.

Lunches

- Lunch materials will be brought to the group at their designated eating area.

- Participants will make their own lunches and are encouraged to use gloves, tongs and clean hands prior to making lunch.
- Igloo coolers to be cleaned and bleached at the end of each day by La Cocina staff.

Worksite

Prior to Group's Arrival

- Meeting with the family; going over social distancing and face mask requirements.
- Assessing the bathroom situation to be able to let the group know.
- Demarcating the boundaries of the worksite for the group to stay within.

Re-Viewing Standards

- Encouraging the group to continue to follow rules (staying within the demarcated area, washing hands prior to eating, etc.).
- Making sure that the group's Safety Person has the paperwork they need (to log temperatures).
- Ending the day with instructions about picking up tools, cleaning things, washing hands.
- Confirming that everyone has taken their temperature prior to leaving for the worksite (at camp) and prior to dinner.
- Reminding everyone about socially distanced interactions with the community/neighbors/family.

Tools

- Ensuring that all rented tools are being sanitized at the end of each day.
